

# **Adaption Information**

## **Animal Care qualifications**

### **Current Approach:**

Assessments developed and internally assessed by Centres. A portfolio of evidence of assessment is produced by each learner. Learners must demonstrate achievement of all assessment criteria in order to achieve the qualification.

It is already the case that a wide variety of assessment methods may be used for the portfolio, so long as evidence meets the guidance provided within the qualification guide and the evidence is attributable to the individual learner.

### **Suggested Adaption Methods:**

We are currently advising centres to do their best to achieve the minimum hours, but we understand that this might not be entirely possible currently. Therefore, we suggest that as long as you are meeting the assessment criteria and obtain enough practical evidence, then that is sufficient. Documentation to cover this is more essential than ever, so please ensure that your records are maintained.

We would encourage Centres to complete assessment tasks wherever possible to ensure that evidence is 'banked' in case of further lockdowns or local restrictions. Providers are also asked to save evidence throughout the course that may be used as evidence of achievement of a learner meeting assessment criteria. This may then be used later if assessment is unable to continue as originally planned.

We also would encourage the use of digital methods to assess learners and to store evidence of achievement. Where 'face-to-face' Moderation may not take place, photographic evidence of students work may be required.

For portfolio tasks, alternative methods of assessment may be used such as witness statements of the learner completing the task in a non-assessment setting. This may be underpinned by one of the following methods of assessment:

- Oral guestion and answering.
- A description of how the task is completed by the learner.
- A reflective account of completing the task.

### **Previously Approved Adaptions:**

- Witness statement of a previously completed task that maps against the
  assessment criterion, but was not necessarily undertaken in a formalised
  assessment setting. In such cases this was supplemented by a learner
  account of how the task was undertaken (for example written description,
  or a professional discussion).
- Movement of a Centre-devised examination to an online invigilated examination (with invigilation completed via video conferencing software).

#### **Other Considerations:**

It is a requirement that all assessment criteria are met in order for the learner to achieve the qualification, therefore please do not attempt to adapt the assessment criterion itself. Practical tasks should not be replaced with theory based activities where the assessment criterion requires the practical task to be completed.

Special Considerations should not be used on a whole-cohort basis; special considerations apply where there is an issue relating to a specific learner.
