## Background

#### • Summer 2020 – ERF (Extraordinary Regulatory Framework)

- Some qualifications those most like A-Levels and qualifications for the purpose of progression allowed 'CAGs' (Centre Assessed Grades).
- Some qualifications allowed assessment methods to be adapted.
- Some qualifications assessed as usual.
- 2020-21 Academic Year EERF (Extended Extraordinary Regulatory Framework)
  - Delivery methods or assessment methods may be adapted in line with the requirements of Awarding Organisations.
  - Centres encouraged to continue assessing and delivering as usual.



## DfE / Ofqual Consultation – January 2021

#### DfE:

- Alternative arrangements to written exams for qualifications most like GCSEs and A-Levels.
- Some form of teacher assessment is likely to be most appropriate.
- Where the qualification demonstrate occupational competency or leads to a licence to practice, assessment should continue, in line with public health guidance.

#### Ofqual:

- Awarding Organisations may make awards where not all assessments have taken place.
- Awarding Organisations to determine the minimum threshold for evidence in order for a qualification to be awarded.
- Awarding Organisations should be encouraged to make consistent decisions across the sector.
- Awarding Organisations should be able to provide clear and timely guidance to teachers to on how grades will be awarded and what they need to do.



## Introducing the VCRF

- VTQ Contingency Regulatory Framework
- Replaces the ERF and the EERF
- Effective from 1<sup>st</sup> August 2020 to 31<sup>st</sup> August 2021
- Two categories of qualifications:
  - Category A `not in scope'
    - These qualifications are most likely to suggest occupational competence or practical skills.
  - Category B 'in scope'
    - Qualifications most like GCSEs and A-Levels.
    - Starting point is those qualifications that allowed estimation (CAGs) in summer 2020.



## The Approach: 'Category A' Qualifications

#### Category A qualifications (those `not in scope')

- Assessments should be delivered as usual where possible.
- Centres may make adaptations in line with the requirements set out by their Awarding Organisations.
- If a qualification cannot be assessed and adaptations cannot be utilised, assessment should be delayed.



## The Approach: 'Category B' Qualifications

#### Category B qualifications ('in scope')

- Assessments should be delivered as usual where possible.
- Centres may make adaptations in line with the requirements set out by their Awarding Organisations.
- If a qualification cannot be assessed and adaptations cannot be utilised, a teacher assessment may be used.
- These will be called Teacher Assessed Grades TAGs
- This will be a qualification level decision, meaning that we may not have unit-level results (or 'teacher assessments') for learners.
- Ofqual are proposing that they temporarily remove the requirements for Awarding Organisations to produce a transcript alongside certificates.

### Next Steps

- We will publish the full listing of our categorisation decisions on our website on 1<sup>st</sup> March.
- We will consider and response to Centres our requirements with regard to minimum evidential thresholds.
  - This may include a set percentage for some qualifications, but may include specific content for other qualifications.
- We will publish guidance for Centres, including the evidence we would expect to see and our IQA expectations.
- We will release an appeals process for qualifications awarded through Teacher Assessed Grades (TAGs) – learners will be able to appeal both against the process for awarding the grade and also the grading decision itself.
