# **About the End-point assessment**

This occupation is found in informal settings such as youth clubs, activity-based projects and social action projects; or more formal settings such as schools, Early Help or youth offending and in local authority, charity, private or voluntary organisations. Youth support workers may work in more specialist settings such as schools, alternative education provisions, hospitals, youth justice environments or within the social care system. Work in a supporting role with young people aged 11-25 to promote their personal, social and educational development.

### **Gateway Requirements**

Apprentices will need to achieve the following mandatory qualifications:

- Level 3 Diploma in Youth Work Practice
- · Level 2 English and Mathematics.

A Portfolio of Evidence must be submitted, which underpins the Professional Discussion assessment component.

Typical duration to Gateway: 12 months.

#### The Assessment

The apprentice will be assessed against the Youth Support Worker requirements. The methods of assessment are:

- Observation with questions
- Professional discussion underpinned by a portfolio of evidence

Skills and Education Group Awards is the End-point Assessment Organisation (EPAO) that is approved and registered with the Education and Skills Funding Agency (ESFA) for this apprenticeship.
