About the End-Point Assessment

This occupation is found in informal settings such as youth clubs, activity-based projects and social action projects; or more formal settings such as schools, Early Help or youth offending and in local authority, charity, private or voluntary organisations.

Youth support workers may work in more specialist settings such as schools, alternative education provisions, hospitals, youth justice environments or within the social care system.

In all cases, safeguarding young people, following health and safety and equal opportunities policies will be central. Youth support workers deliver youth support work in local and area projects.

The broad purpose of the occupation is to work in a supporting role with young people aged 11-25 (predominantly in the age range of 11-19) to promote their personal, social and educational development

Gateway Requirements

Apprentices will need to achieve the following mandatory qualifications:

- Level 3 Diploma in Youth Work Practice
- Level 2 English and maths (where applicable, in line with funding rules).

A Portfolio of Evidence must be submitted, which underpins the Professional Discussion assessment component.

Typical duration to Gateway: 18 months.

The Assessment

The apprentice will be assessed against the Youth Support Worker requirements.

The methods of assessment are:

- Observation with questions
- Professional discussion underpinned by a portfolio of evidence
