Overview

The suite of Skills and Education Group Awards Counselling qualifications have been in operation for over 20 years and were developed in response to the need to provide a structure for the approval of counsellor training programmes.

The Level 2 suite offers an excellent range of qualifications which provide you with an introduction, for those who have had no previous experience of, or training in the field of counselling. The Level 2 Certificate in Counselling Skills enables you the opportunity to develop a range of introductory counselling skills, techniques, and theoretical knowledge. All of which are developed through the following themes: communication, reflection, theories and diversity. This qualification provides a useful progression route into further study and it is not a license to practice.

The SEG Awards Level 3 Counselling qualifications (Certificate and Diploma) are designed for those seeking progression to become a qualified professional counsellor or for individuals who wish to acquire counselling skills for use in other work areas, e.g. nurses, social workers, teachers. Themes that are covered include counselling theories, ethics and diversity, and personal awareness. The purpose of this qualification is to provide you with a useful vocational progression route into further study and is not a license to practice.

The SEG Awards Level 4 Diploma in Therapeutic Counselling supports learners to develop and demonstrate skills, knowledge and understanding of Counselling, towards achieving professional status as a counselling practitioner. It is also suitable for learners in work roles where counselling skills are needed for example: nursing, teaching, social work, voluntary sector, the police and armed forces.



Benefits for learners

Undertaking this qualification allows learners to:

- Enhance and improve your verbal and written communication skills
- Develop a basic understanding of the counselling concepts
- Develop an understanding of the importance of continuously developing self-awareness. Which is particularly important for learners who may wish to progress to further study and qualifications leading towards becoming a counsellor
- Demonstrate core counselling skills in a helping relationship
- Develop knowledge and understanding of counselling theories
- Demonstrate ways to address difference and diversity in counselling skills practice
- Achieve a nationally recognised Level 2 qualification that is vocationally focused
- Prepare for progression onto appropriate, higher level qualifications

Who is the qualification for?

The SEG Awards Level 2 Certificate in Counselling is a qualification designed to prepare individuals (16+) for further learning and training through the development of knowledge and skills in counselling.

This qualification is suitable for you if you have no previous experience of using counselling skills. Its versatility appeals to a wide range of potential learners and the target market includes those:

- Returning to study
- Seeking a career change
- Undertaking voluntary work
- Enhancing career prospects through extra qualifications
- Thinking of training as a professional counsellor
- Seeking development of enhanced social skills

The qualification allows you to make a more informed choice as to whether or not to embark on a demanding vocational training towards a possible career in counselling or an allied career, e.g. welfare advice work, where counselling skills would be useful. It is also intended for those who wish to improve their listening and communication skills.



Although there are no formal entry requirements, you should be aware, either by interview or other suitable methods, that the course involves experiential learning and self-awareness exercises, which will be demanding of the self in interaction with others.

This 16 credit qualification has four mandatory 4-credit units. All are vocational and relate to the sector in the title. Both the minimum and maximum vocational content is 100%.

Skills and Education Group Awards expects approved centres to recruit with integrity on the basis of a learner's ability to contribute to and successfully complete all the requirements of a unit/s or the full qualification.

What does the qualification cover?

The SEG Awards Level 2 Certificate in Counselling Skills qualification covers the following four topics:

Counselling Skills and Personal Development – In this unit learners will have an opportunity to reflect on their personal and future development and identify potential sources of support.

Using Counselling Skills – In this unit learners will have an opportunity to develop counselling skills in a helping relationship and learn to establish appropriate boundaries.

Introduction to Counselling Skills Theories – In this unit learners will have an opportunity to develop knowledge of the three main counselling theoretical approaches enabling a link to be made between counselling theory and skills.

Diversity and Ethics in the Use of Counselling Skills – In this unit learners will have an opportunity to gain an understanding of the contexts and ethics relevant to the use of counselling skills.

The content of the qualification will support you to develop and expand your counselling skills, knowledge and understanding, at level 2.

Centres will adopt a delivery approach which supports your development, including plenty of opportunities for group work exercises.



You will produce a portfolio of evidence for example; observations, witness statements, group discussion observation sheets, case studies, reports/notes.

What could this qualification lead to?

Will the qualification lead to employment, and if so, in which job role and at what level?

Successful completion of the SEG Awards Level 2 Certificate in Counselling Skills will not lead you directly into employment, but provides you with both skills experience and knowledge of Counselling at level 2. This sound introduction enables you to make an informed choice as to whether or not to embark on demanding vocational training towards a possible career in counselling or an allied career where counselling skills would be useful.

Will this qualification lead to further learning?

This Level 2 Certificate in Counselling Skills is not intended to train counsellors and you will not be qualified to practice as a counsellor on completion. To do this, you will need to undertake further training, onto higher level of study and skills acquisition. An example of which includes Level 3 Certificate or Diploma in Counselling Skills, which leads through onto the SEG Awards Level 4 Diploma in Therapeutic Counselling or other such equivalent qualifications. Postgraduate and post qualifying qualifications in counselling studies are available to enhance the practice, skills and knowledge of a practising counsellor. You may also progress towards national accreditation status with professional lead bodies.

If there are larger and/or smaller versions of this qualification or it is available at different skills levels, why should a student take this particular one?

The SEG Awards Level 2 Certificate in Counselling Skills is part of a small suite of qualifications:

- Level 2 Award in Counselling Concepts 500/9145/1
- Level 2 Award in Counselling Skills 600/1050/2
- Level 2 Certificate in Counselling Skills 600/1051/4



The reason for having the varying sizes of qualification in the suite at level 2 is to meet the various needs of you the learner.

The Level 2 Award in Counselling Concepts is an introductory qualification which provides you with an opportunity to develop a basic understanding of counselling. You will be able to compare and contrast counselling with other forms of helping activities. Through experiential learning you will develop an understanding of what counselling training entails. This will assist you to make a more informed choice as to whether or not you are suited to undertake vocational counselling training as opposed to other types of training. Progression is possible from this qualification onto the SEG Awards Level 3 Certificate in counselling Skills (500/9286/8) but is not automatic.

The Level 2 Award in Counselling Skills provides you with the opportunity to develop skills and knowledge to progress into further learning and training. This qualification is also an introduction into counselling, providing you with an opportunity to develop counselling skills in a helping relationship and to learn to establish appropriate boundaries. This qualification differs slightly from the Level 2 Award in Counselling concepts. With the Skills qualification you will develop an understanding of how counselling theories underpin the use of counselling skills. In addition you will also develop knowledge of how self-reflection contributes to personal development and understand its benefits on the use of counselling skills.

If you complete the SEG Awards Level 2 Award in Counselling Skills you will be able to credit transfer any units successfully completed to the Level 2 Certificate in Counselling Skills.

The Level 2 Certificate is for you, if you want to build on either of the introductory Level 2 Awards and want to develop a broader perspective of Counselling. You will develop knowledge of how to meet your own support needs in order to contribute to a helping relationship. This will enable you to understand how personal and/or professional support can be used to highlight issues arising from the use of counselling skills practice. You will also develop an understanding about anti-discriminatory practice, the impacts of diversity on counselling relationships and ways to address differences and diversity.
