

Purpose Statement

SEG Awards Level 3 Award in Wildlife Photography – 610/3750/3

Overview

The SEG Awards Level 3 Award in Wildlife Photography has been designed to develop knowledge and skills within wildlife photography.

Who is this qualification for?

The SEG Awards Level 3 Award in Wildlife Photography is designed for learners of the age of 16 and over, who are interested in wildlife photography and would like to gain experience and knowledge within this field. It is important for Learners to have a passion or interest in animals and be comfortable with working in an outside environment.

There are no entry requirements for this qualification.

What does the qualification cover?

The SEG Awards Level 3 Award in Small Animal Care and Welfare has been designed to provide learners with the knowledge, experience and acknowledgement of work in the wildlife. This qualification gives learners the experience to learn the basic techniques in digital photography. By obtaining this qualification, learners will be able to progress into further education within this field and the opportunity to gain employment within this field.

The qualification covers:

- **Electronic Photography** - Learners will acknowledge skills to begin in Electronic Photography with a particular aim towards animal and wildlife photography.
- **Nature and Wildlife Photography** - This unit will allow learners to understand the abilities and attributes required in wildlife photography, including how to portray a tale within a photo as well as alternative images of wild animals and environment.

Practical Hours Requirement

There is no external practical hour requirements attached to this qualification.

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Assessments

This qualification is to be completed by portfolio submission, with clear evidencing linked to the relevant Assessment Criteria.

Unless stated otherwise, Skills and Education Group Awards require a minimum of three examples when learners are asked to demonstrate various methods or techniques. This requirement ensures that the learner shows a clear understanding of the assessment criteria.

What could this qualification lead to?

By obtaining this qualification, learners will have the necessary skills and knowledge to allow them the opportunity to potentially progress into employment within field and areas of the field which are linked, for example, professional animal portraits. Learners can also develop their education further by applying to study Level 3 Award in Pet Photography to develop their experience and their professional portfolio.

This qualification goes hand in hand with a variety of Skills and Education Group Awards regulated qualifications within the Animal Care sector, supporting learners' knowledge and experience in animal photography.

Centres should be aware that Reasonable Adjustments, which may be permitted for assessment, may in some instances limit a learner's progression into the sector. Centres must, therefore, inform learners of any limits their learning difficulty may impose on future progression.
