Overview

The SEG Awards Entry Level Award in ESOL Skills for Life in Writing (Entry 2) is designed to help learners improve their foundational English writing skills necessary for daily life, work, and further education. It provides a structured approach to learning, focusing on practical and relevant content to help learners integrate more easily into English-speaking environments.

Objectives

1. Develop Basic Writing Skills:

- Writing simple sentences and short texts.
- Using basic punctuation and capitalisation.
- Spelling common words correctly.

2. Improve Sentence Structure:

- Constructing grammatically correct sentences.
- Using a variety of sentence types (statements, questions, commands).
- Linking sentences to form coherent paragraphs.

3. Increase Vocabulary and Grammar:

- Learning and using common vocabulary in writing.
- Applying basic grammar rules (subject-verb agreement, verb tenses).
- Using appropriate word order in sentences.

Who is this qualification for?

- **Non-native English speakers**: Individuals who are beginners in learning English.
- **Residents in English-speaking countries**: Particularly aimed at those living in the UK who need to develop basic literacy skills to function effectively in society.



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What does the qualification cover?

1. Types of Writing Tasks:

- Writing personal information (e.g., filling out forms).
- Composing short notes, emails, and letters.
- Describing daily routines, activities, and personal experiences.

2. Writing Skills Focus:

- Sentence Construction: Building simple and compound sentences.
- **Punctuation and Capitalisation**: Correct use of punctuation and capital letters.
- **Spelling**: Accurate spelling of common and familiar words.

Assessment

Form Filling:

Completing short writing tasks, such as forms or notes.

Short Text Writing:

- Writing short paragraphs on familiar topics.
- Responding to prompts with appropriate sentence structures.

Labeling:

• Labeling items in a picture or diagram with appropriate words.

Teaching and Learning Approaches

Classroom Activities:

- Group activities and games to reinforce vocabulary and sentence structures.
- Pair and group work to practice writing in a collaborative setting.

What could this qualification lead to?

After completing Entry 2, learners can move on to ESOL Skills for Life Writing Entry 3, where they will build on their foundational skills and tackle more complex writing tasks.

This qualification aims to help learners improve their English writing skills, boosting their confidence in everyday communication and paving the way for further education or employment opportunities.
